Assessment AS

Component 1: Speaking. (30 % of the qualification)

Speaking assessment 12-14 minutes, plus an additional 15 minutes preparation.

- 2 picture stimulus cards in French on two themes.
- Each discussion will last 6-7 minutes.

Component 2:Listening, Reading and Translation. (50% of the qualification) 2 hours

- Section A Listening: True or false statements/Multiple choice/Gap fill/Summary/Questions and answers in French.
- Section B Reading: gap fill questions/summary/questions and answers in French.
- Section 3 Translation: unseen passages from French into English (about 70 words)

unseen sentences or short texts from English into French (about 70 words)

Component 3: Critical Response in Writing. (20 % of the qualification) 1 hour and 15 minutes

1 essay in French that requires an in-depth critical response to an aspect or aspects of the work studied eg: imagery, characterisation, a specific scene, incident or character.

There is a choice of 2 questions for the task.



Course content A Level

Diversity and difference.

- Migration and integration.
- Cultural identity and marginalisation.
- Cultural enrichment and celebrating difference.
- Discrimination and diversity.

France 1940-1950: the Occupation and post war years.

- From June 1940-may 1945 (occupation, liberation, and end of WW2).
- Life in occupied France and the cultural dimension (théâtre, cinéma, littérature).
- 1945-1950: rebuilding and restructuring.
- Repercussions for modern day France.



Assessment A Level (1)

Component 1: Speaking. (30 % of the qualification)

Speaking assessment 21-23 minutes including 5 minutes preparation (2 tasks)

Task 1a- presentation of independent research project (2 minutes)

Task 1b- Discussion on the content of the research project (9-10 minutes)

Task 2

A discussion based on a stimulus card relating to one of the 4 themes studied (5 minutes preparation time followed by 5-6 minutes discussion)

Independent research project

- Opportunity to study something not in the specification
- The topic chosen must relate to France or French speaking country
- Can't be a text or film from prescribed list but can be a film or text of own choice



Assessment A Level (2)

Component 2:Listening, Reading and Translation (50% of the qualification) 2 hours 30 minutes

- Section A Listening: True or false statements/Multiple choice/Summary/Questions and answers in French.
- Section B Reading: gap fill questions/summary/questions and answers in French.
- Section 3 Translation: unseen passages from French into English (about 100 words)
 unseen sentences or short texts from English into French (about 100 words)

Component 3: Critical and analytical Response in Writing (20 % of the qualification)

2 hours

2 essays in French

- 1 essay on literary work selected from prescribed list.
- 1 essay on either a second literary work or a film from prescribed list.
