

# School Attendance Medical Appointments

Please ensure that you notify school of any appointments in good time. If you have an emergency appointment booked, please try and

notify school as soon as possible so that we can make arrangements for your child/ward to be at Reception in good time.

In line with our **Attendance Policy** and instruction from the Local Authority and DfE, we request that a copy of the appointment letter is sent in to school. Alternatively, a photo of the letter sent via the attendance email address will also satisfy this requirement. An appointment card or text are also acceptable providing the pupil's name is clearly written on it.

Please try to make appointments outside of the school day. It is understood that hospital and orthodontist appointments are often immovable, but could we please ask that dental check-up appointments or non-emergency optician appointments are made after school hours, in the case of opticians, this can also be done at the weekend (e.g. Specsavers and Vision Express are both open over the weekend for testing).

#### Leave of Absence

A request for leave of absence will need to be made for **any** event in term-time which affects the school day, for example, taking part in a sports/dance event at competition level, sitting a music exam.
