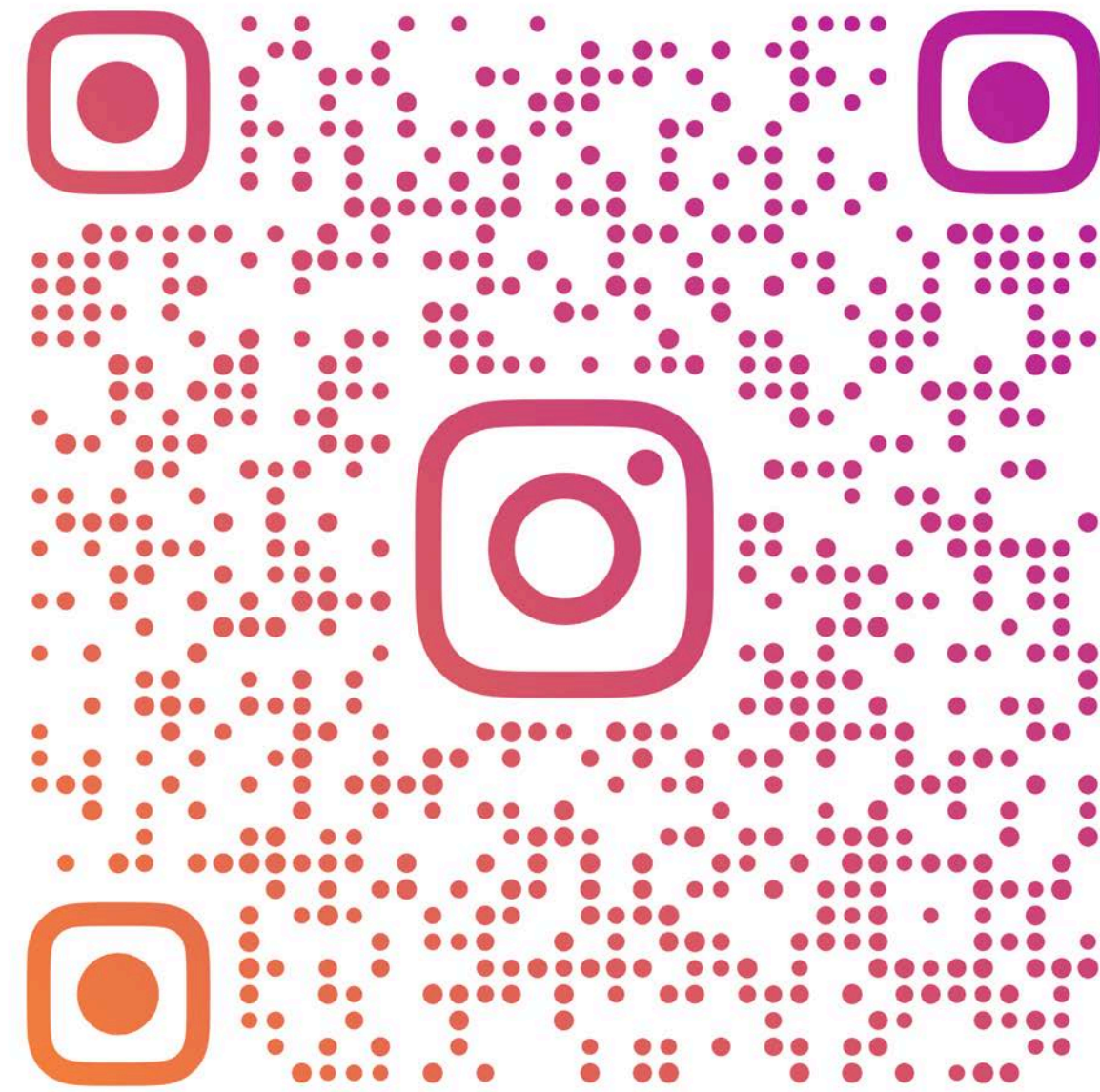

# Supervised Study vs Non Contact Periods

## Supervised Study:

In a classroom or the Common Room with a designated teacher.

Quiet study that you must be prepared for ( i.e. if in a classroom and no IT useage)

Extra 8 hours of study per subject, coursework and revision

## Non Contact:

You can spend this in the SFC, CR, or Library.

You may go to a specialised classroom i.e. Art or music, once you have informed the sixth form secretary.

Informal work setting that still requires study.

# Supervised Study & Non Contact Periods

## What Should I do...

- **Consolidate your knowledge: flashcards, revise over content, condense notes.**
- **Retrieve your knowledge (spider diagrams from memory, using your flashcards).**
- **Recap over your notes before the next lesson.**
- **Complete exam questions.**
- **Mark exam questions.**
- **Reflect on the mistakes made during exam questions.**
- **Read around the subject.**
- **Research around the subject.**
- **Watch documentaries / listen to podcasts about the topic / subject.**
- **If you are not part of silent study you could teach someone else in your class / complete collaborative study about the content and then swap over. Quiz each other. To do this, it needs to be productive!**
- **Homework.**

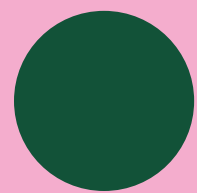

# Dress Code

## What Is Permitted:

- Blazers must be worn for assembly on Friday (black, blue, grey or cream).
- You should be in business attire.
- Tailored trousers or skirt (black, blue or grey).
- Tights are compulsory with dresses and skirts.
- Smart full length top or shirt.
- Smart black shoes.
- Sixth form lanyard.
- Coats (outside the building only).
- Hair may be dyed but must be natural colours.
- False eyelashes and nails - are allowed in Sixth Form.
- Nose rings are not allowed, you may only have one small nose stud.
- No other facial jewellery other than earrings are permitted.

## What Is NOT Permitted:

- Jeans.
- Shorts.
- Leggings.
- Short skirts (over 2 inches above the knee).
- Tops with logos.
- Strappy and / or cropped tops.
- Sweatshirts / hoodies / heavy knit.
- Trainers, white soled or canvas shoes.
- Dr Marten / Biker Style Boots.
- Nose rings or other facial jewellery, other than a small nose stud and earrings.
- No coats during assembly.

# Attendance and Punctuality

# Supporting Student Learning: Bursaries:

**The 16-19 Bursary Fund consists of two different types, and students are able to apply for one or the other of the bursaries according to their financial circumstances.**

**Only students who are eligible should apply.**

**A Vulnerable Bursary Fund of £1,200 per annum for students in the following categories:**

- Young people who are 16-19 years, living independently and claiming Income Support or Universal Credit.**
- Young people who are looked after by the Local Authority.**
- Young people who are Care Leavers i.e. are no longer looked after by the Local Authority.**
- Young people who are 16-19 years, a parent and receiving Income Support or Universal Credit.**
- Young people who are 16-19 years and receive Income Support or Universal Credit for any reason.**

# Supporting Student Learning: Bursaries:

**A Discretionary Bursary for students who are in a situation of particular financial hardship which is preventing them from making the required progress.**

- The Education Funding Agency guidelines advise that it is best practice to pay ‘in kind’ rather than cash:
  - Bus pass.**
  - Text books.**
  - Equipment.**
  - Field trips.****

**The amount of funding allocated to the individual student will depend upon the individual financial circumstances of the student and the number of students who have access to the fund.**

**If you believe you are entitled to a bursary please keep any receipts to make a claim.**

# Supporting Student Learning: Bursaries:

The following will be taken into account when determining a student's eligibility:

- 1. Whether the student is entitled to free school meals.**
- 2. If the student's household is on a low income (below £29,500) or in receipt of an 'income-based benefit'. By 'income-based benefit' we mean the following:**
  - Income Support or Universal Credit**
  - Working Tax Credit/Child Tax Credit**
  - Income based Employment and Support Allowance**
  - Other benefits and pensions**
- 3. If exceptional financial circumstances apply, evidence of income must be supplied.**
- 4. If you do not meet any of the above criteria but feel you would benefit from additional financial support, please complete the application form and detail the reasons in the additional comments box. Each application will be considered on the students own personal circumstances.**
