It streamlines the process by allowing students to submit a single application to up to five courses simultaneously.

National Careers Service

The National Careers Service provides free, impartial information, advice, and guidance to help individuals make decisions about learning, training, and work. It is available to anyone in England aged 13 or over.

Key features include:

- Career exploration.
- Skills assessments.
- Course & job search.
- Personalised action plans.

Face-to-Face Advisers: Localised, in-person appointments are often available through community hubs, job centres, or local outreach programs.

Success at School

Is a national careers website in the UK aimed at students aged 11-19, helping them explore future careers, university options, and apprenticeships. It also provides resources for teachers, careers advisors, and parents to help guide young people into the workforce.

Connexions / Career Connect Wirral

In the Wirral area, the youth national Connexions service operates under the name Career Connect Wirral. They provide free, tailored careers advice, employment support, and guidance on local education or training options.

The service is open to Wirral residents aged 16 to 19. It extends up to age 25 if you have an Education, Health, and Care (EHC) plan. It specifically targets those who are not currently in education, employment, or training (NEET).

You can visit their local team in Birkenhead without needing an appointment.
